During her time in the union Liz has served at Branch, Regional and National levels of the union including periods on both NATFHE and UCU's National Executives. She has served as National Negotiator for Higher Education since 1994 and has played a prominent role on the union's Equality Committee.

Liz is a champion of a member led, democratic and accountable UCU and has taken a lead in the development of strong regional organization, as the long time secretary of Yorkshire and Humberside region of the union.



**U**CU members face a critical time in the campaign to defend public education. Privatisation and the growing market culture in adult, further and higher education are destroying the quality of education and undermining job security and conditions of service.

We need to campaign against privatisation and for education as a public service, based on defence of academic freedom and widening participation.

Good quality education for students and good quality conditions for education staff are two sides of the same coin. We need action on pay, pensions and workloads. We should build this as part of UK-wide and international resistance to austerity programmes.

Excessive workloads are the number one problem of working life for our members in adult, further and higher education. UCU should do more to campaign and negotiate to reduce workloads.

We must maintain and develop contractual safeguards around working hours, teaching hours, research time, and the length of the working week and year.

To reverse privatisation and work intensification we need an effective union. This means:

- \* Recruiting more members, especially new staff
- \* More local representatives
- \* Building strong branch committees
- \* Maintaining regions
- \* Robust local and national negotiating
- \* Understanding the link between negotiation and industrial action
- \* Not giving away past gains at the negotiating table
- \* Ensuring that equality issues are central to our bargaining agenda
- \* Defending the rights of part-time and casualised staff
- \* Electing an NEC prepared to authorise industrial action when members vote for it

Above all an effective union is a democratic union. We must uphold the sovereignty of Annual Congress and Sector Conferences.
